JBB's World War II Day:

Rufus (Year 6) writes: On Tuesday, JBB had a World War II styled day. Children were allowed to dress up as any type of person from the 1940's. Everyone had a great time in each sector of the day. Before the school's first break, Year 5



and 6 had a lesson from very knowledgeable people from the Horsham Museum.

They taught JBB about children's life during World War II. They shared information with the children about rationing, the difficulties of being an evacuee and more. JBB were split up into 3 groups to carefully handle objects from the era.

JBB then made slideshows about women's role in the war. Year 5 and 6 also performed reading out some letters from our class reader. These were recorded in front of the Green Screen. In the afternoon JBB continued to perform the letters and write their slideshows. Finally, the class completed a "boot camp" style P.E lesson. They were split into groups (red, blue and green) to do an exciting lesson with Matt. They did two different relay races and reaction activities.







Owen said: "I think it was quite scary but we all had lots of fun." For Sophie: "It was fun dressing up in costumes and handling the old equipment they used to use." George liked, "P.E when we did a boot camp." Jonny said: "I really liked trying on the different RAF and army uniforms."

Upcoming Harvest Festival Concert




School Photographer
