

# Measuring temperature using a thermometer

Discover

Celsius is a unit for measuring **temperature**.

a) The **thermometer** scale shows degrees.



This shows 11 °C.

It is 11 °C in York.  
Eve lives in York.

b) Look at the map.  
It is 9 °C in Aberdeen.



a) Eve is at home looking at a thermometer.  
Where does Eve live?




b) Marta says, 'Where I live is 3 °C warmer than Aberdeen.'  
Where does Marta live?

‘°C’ stands for ‘**degrees Celsius**’. You can just say ‘degrees’.

I will count on from 10 °C.

The warmer the temperature, the higher the number. I will count on.




It is 12 °C where Marta lives.  
Marta lives in Edinburgh.



3 Simon lives in Oxford.


He has three .
