




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
Digital Leaders


William Penn uses a programme called Purple Mash to deliver the Computing Curriculum and has consequently elected children from years three, four, five and six to be Digital Leaders.

The leaders will have great responsibility within the school as they will:

- Ensure laptops and Chromebooks are fully charged
- Increase usage of equipment within the school,
- Report malfunctioning equipment,
- Offer homework help,
- Produce a termly insert for the newsletter for parents with advice about Purple Mash and other technology at home.







The leaders will be able to help, support and advise pupils from all year groups and they will inform pupils on internet safety features such as the *Smart* rules. 



Pupil Achievements Outside of School
