#### Water Aid Workshops




To celebrate World Water Day 2024 a volunteer from Water Aid came in to talk to Key Stage 2 about the importance of water. This supported the children's learning about their rights as we continue our journey to become a Rights Respecting School. Children discussed how often and easily



## **Parent Surveys**



## **PE Days and Kits**



#### Terracycle Recycling at William Penn Primary School

Thank you for your amazing efforts in helping us to collect recycling at the school. Please do continue to bring in the following items as these are still on triple points from Terracycle until 5<sup>th</sup> April.

• SNACK WRAPPERS - Sweet biscuit wrappers, cake wrappers, including the cellophane. Savoury biscuit wrappers such as cracker wrappers (not the cardboard, just the plastic wrapping).

PRINGLE TUBES – pringle tubes (no other make). Without the lids.

• DENTAL ITEMS – electric toothbrush head – change those toothbrush heads and help the school! Manual toothbrushes, flossing sticks, electric flosser nozzles, dental floss containers.

Also remember we can recycle the following items at school too:

- PENS and TIP-EX this includes pens, highlighters, felt tips, markers, mechanical pencils, tip-ex mice, tip-ex fluid (and other brands), fountain pens and ink cartridges (NO glue sticks, rubbers, rulers, pencils or sharp objects such as scissors)
- PLASTIC FOOD STORAGE CONTAINERS and DRINKS BOTTLES all brands of plastic food storage containers and lids such as Sistema, all brands of reusable plastic water bottles and caps. Please do bring in any of those sandwich containers or water bottles that have gone past their best, or maybe cracked and broken!

#### King of the Dojos


