


Newsletter – 31.1.25

RSPB – The Big Garden Birdwatch, 24th January

We were lucky to get involved in the RSPB birdwatch last Friday. The Big Garden Birdwatch is the UK's biggest citizen science wildlife survey. The Birdwatch helps the RSPB understand how garden birds are doing in our area.

It was so lovely for so many children to be interested in the event and we are lucky to see so many birds in our beautiful grounds. The children spotted many birds which we have encouraged to our grounds with bird food. Thank you to Lola-Rose who bought in extra food and a bird feeder.
