If you have selected a virtual appointment, please provide the class teacher or office with a number you can be contacted on, just in case there are any technical issues.

Online appointments: How to Access your Slot at the Allotted Time

These bookings will last approximately 5 minutes as teachers will need to prepare for the next appointment.

- Step 1: Ensure you are in a quiet space.
- Step 2: Log in to your child's account we have found previously that this bypasses the waiting room and makes the process
 of joining more reliable. You should be able to log in from multiple locations using the same account, if this makes the
 process more convenient for you.
- Step 3: Find the relevant Parent Consultation document on the Whole School Stream and open it.
- Step 4: Click on the Meet Code next to your child's name.
- Step 5: Press join to join the meeting.
- Step 6: Turn on your camera and microphone.
- If any technical issues arise, the class teacher will phone you on the number you have provided them with.
- Alternatively, please attend the school in person and wait in the school hall for your appointment time. Please be punctual as the appointments will need to dovetail with the online appointments.

This beautiful carol service will take place on the evening of Wednesday 13th December. Be sure to add it to your diary as it is a magical night of singing, musical performances and festive charm.




School Photographer

Safeguarding/Health and Safety/Wellbeing Update

Administration of Medicines in School

If your child requires medication during the school day, please contact the school office to make these arrangements. Pupils are not permitted to have medicines on their person in school and this includes creams, cough sweets etc. Also, if your child has an inhaler in school, it is good practice to have a spare. This ensures your child is able to receive the medical support, should one run out. Also a reminder that we are trying to be as nut free as possible. You also need to be aware that because of our current cohort, we ask that you do not send in products containing sesame seeds, as they can trigger an allergic reaction in children who have a nut allergy. Thank you for helping us to keep all children safe at school.





Parking

It has become apparent that some parents are mounting the pavement when parking, either parking on the pavement or in order to access a space. This is concerning, as pedestrians cannot always be seen, especially children. Pedestrians will naturally assume that the pavement is a safe place for them to be and we would ask that this is the case.
