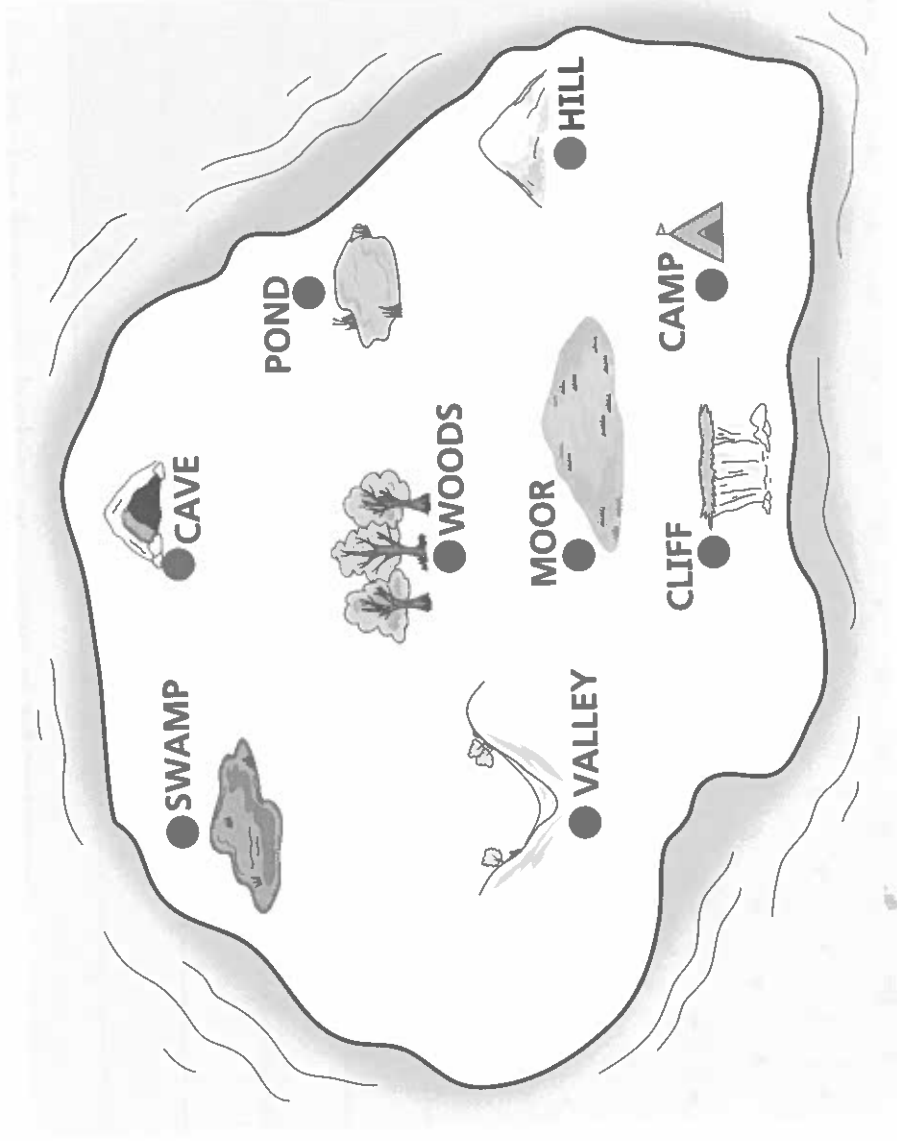

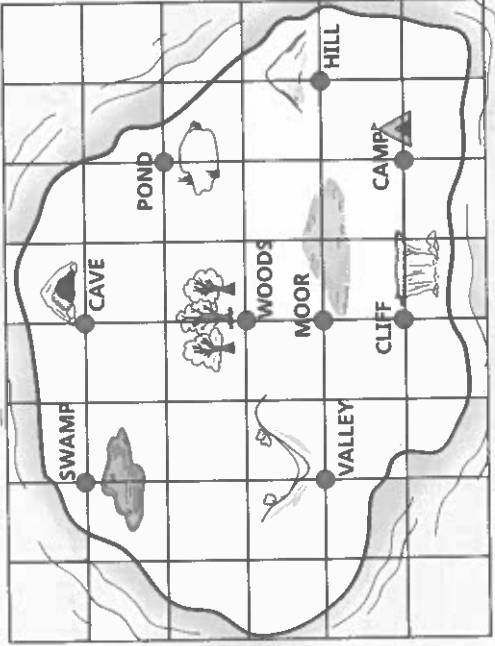


Andy

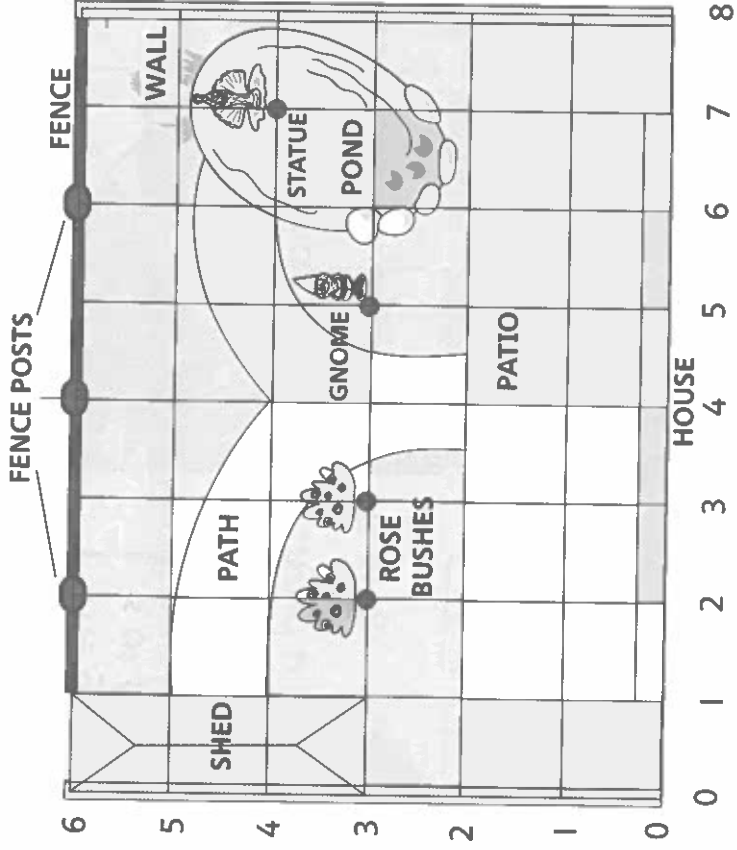
