The school continues to receive support from the local authority, and other locality schools during this time.





School Lunches and Census Day

Special Theme Lunch Menu – Thursday 5th October

On Thursday 5th October our lunch provider will be delivering a lunch menu offering a range of dishes as well as a chocolate brownie, to make it extra special! If your child has a special diet, please be assured that their usual menu will remain in place. We would respectfully ask that all children in Cadbury and Fox Classes (Year R,1,2) sample/have a hot meal on this day as the amount that the school pays for school lunches over time will be set according to take up on this day. A low take up will cost the school a great deal of money which we cannot then spend on resources and children's learning. Key Stage 2 pupils are very welcome to order the meal in the usual way. Each child will be given a meal, or the option to sample. If your child is used to having a packed lunch, you are very welcome to send this in as well so as to make sure that they have eaten sufficiently well.





Are You Eligible for Free School Meals?

Please consider whether your child is eligible for Free School Meals. Obviously the purpose of this fund is to provide meals for pupils. However, non identifying data is also used to allocate additional funding to the school and eligible parents should register whether their children receive a meal because they are in Key Stage 1 or not.

West Sussex County Council has an application form for parents to check Free School Meal Eligibility. In order to make this process easier, the County Council has a Free School Meals page on the West Sussex County Council website and an application form that enables the council to check parents' eligibility for free school meals.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income
 of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a
 year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

There are a small number of spaces available for beginner recorder lessons this term (Years 1-3), allocated on a first come, first served basis. Lessons cost £9.10 per lesson. A bursary is available to cover the cost in some circumstances. Safeguarding/Health and Safety/Wellbeing Update




We are trying to be as nut free as possible.

As we start the new year, please can I remind you that we are trying to be as nut free as possible in school. Pupils who suffer from nut allergies can develop a severe, potentially life-threatening allergic reaction. If a child has a nut allergy, it is not just eating the nuts that can cause the reaction. Just being touched on the skin or smelling the breath of someone who has eaten nuts, or a product containing nuts, can trigger anaphylactic shock (which can cause breathing and swallowing difficulties).

Please ensure that no nut products are included in lunch boxes or brought into the school as snacks. For example:

Peanut butter sandwiches







- Chocolate spreads
