
May Day Celebrations




"The play was impressive and I would love the Rainbow Theatre to join us for other topics," Caleb, Year 3.


"I loved the Greek dance at the end, it was hard and we didn't always get it right first time but it was really funny!" Alfie, Year 4.




School Uniform and PE Kits

Pupil Achievements Outside of School



Ethan D-A has recently been awarded Player of the Season, for Billingshurst FC. He also came out as the top goal scorer with 15 goals.




